

## Preface

The XIV School of Differential Geometry, jointly organized by the Federal University of Ceará (UFC) and the Institute of Pure and Applied Mathematics (IMPA), occurred in July of 2008 in the city of Fortaleza, Ceará, Brazil, and was dedicated to Manfredo do Carmo on the occasion of his 80'th birthday. As a consequence of this event, the *Revista Matematica Contemporanea* dedicates two volumes in honor of Manfredo. In these volumes there are papers of collaborators and colleagues of Manfredo.

When we were invited to publish these volumes of the *Matematica Contemporanea* specially dedicated to Manfredo, we communicated this fact to several mathematicians worldwide. The reply to this communication was proportional to the solid national and international prestige of do Carmo, evidenced by the high level of the papers composing these volumes.

Manfredo introduced Differential Geometry in Brazil with the contribution of mathematicians who obtained their PhD under his direction, spread all over this immense country, and, with the support of mathematical colleagues.
